WaterSense and LEED Housing Programs

A WaterSense labeled new home includes WaterSense labeled plumbing fixtures, a hot water delivery system that gets hot water to the tap faster, water-smart landscape design, and other water-efficient features. These features allow the home to use 20 percent less water than typical homes. **Jonah Schein** will introduce the New Homes specification, reviewing the criteria and its applicability to newly constructed single-family and multi-family homes. **Asa Foss**, Technical Director for LEED for Homes will provide information on their water efficiency programs and requirements for LEED-certified residential units.
